The Justice Fellowship was initially proposed as a speakers series connecting communities across multiple districts to engage in conversations around equity, justice, and inclusion. From that initial idea, a collaboration was born that brought together staff members from Sarah Lawrence College, Mount Vernon City School District, Yonkers Public Schools, and Bronxville Public School.

A parallel fellowship was designed that created opportunities for students from all three public schools to develop action-based research projects that seek to make meaningful interventions in their communities. The theme for the 2020-21 fellowship is education. With the support of community partners and two Sarah Lawrence Mellon Fellows, students are creating oral histories within their communities around the topics of education and justice. At the end of the school year they will present their projects to an audience of community members and stakeholders.

Fostering partnerships among regional higher education partners and multiple PK-12 school districts is a key component of efforts to effect meaningful change and social action. Please join us on **February 1, 2021**, to learn more about the existing partnership, consider strategies for replication and expansion of the collaborative model in other locations, and share success stories from your schools and colleges. A follow-up workshop will be held at the end of the school year to showcase student work.
